Song Writing

Purpose

The Old Testament book of Psalms represents the “songbook” of generations of God’s people. Over time, great men and women of God continued to put the thoughts of their heart into song. Many of those have become standards in worship services today. Song Writing provides an outlet for a young person’s musical interest and talent in the context of the Lord’s service. Our hope is that some of these participants will grow up to write compositions suitable for publication and use by future generations of worshipers.

Grade Levels

There are four grade levels in this event: 3-4, 5-6, 7-8, 9-12

Process

- Participants will:
 - Write an original *a cappella* composition relating to the current year’s theme.
 - Mail 3 copies of the song and title page and email a copy to seltc.office@gmail.com.
 - Complete a Pre-Convention form (in the Forms Section).
- If more than 1 student works on the presentation, print out Team Sheet from on-line registration portal. (reg.seltc.org)
- The composition, Pre-Convention form and Team Sheet, if applicable, should be sent to SELTC by the pre-convention deadline.
- Each song will be judged and returned, along with judges’ sheets, to the students at the convention.

Rules

- Write an original melody and lyrics. Do not write words “to be sung to the tune of” an existing melody. No awards will be given for lyrics only.
- The lyrics must adhere to this year’s theme.
- You may, instead of writing original lyrics, set a scripture text to music, in which case you must note that fact on your title page.
- When you have finished your composition, sing it in someone else’s hearing to be sure the song can be sang as you think it should be. Then try teaching it to someone.
- Harmony is not required, and no points will be deducted for being melody only.
 - Two-part harmony at least is encouraged in the older grade levels.
 - Improper harmonic chords may result in lower scores
- More than 1 person may work on a composition.
- It is intended that all writers of both words and music be student participants.

Song Writing (continued)

- A typed cover sheet for each song should include the following:
 - Title of the song
 - Scripture text if used
 - Name and grade of participant(s).
 - Name, address, and phone number of the congregation of the participant(s).
 - Congregation LTC Number
- Submit your entry on standard paper (8 ½ inch x 11 inches or smaller).
 - It is acceptable to do the scoring by hand or by use of computer software.
 - If preprinted staff paper is not used, take extra care to make your work neat and readable.
 - Do not staple the pages together.

Awards

There are 3 ratings available in each grade level – Gold, Silver, or Bronze.

If more than 1 person works on the composition, it will be judged in the level of the oldest participant.
